Saturday 23rd January 2016, Cheshire League Division One

Town's stuttering start to 2016 continued with a defeat at home to Pilkington. Despite enjoying the majority of the possession they were left to rue missed chances that ultimately proved costly.

They started brightly and could have gone ahead after 3 mins when Jack Weedall's cross was flicked to the back post by Priestley but James Dean was unable to get enough on the volley and the keeper was able to gather comfortably. Pilkington were unable to take the next chance when a ball forward was flicked on by the centre forward and their pacey winger got in behind the Town defence but lifted his volley over Masters and the other side of the post.

Middlewich went on to create three golden chances to take the lead but were unable to take advantage. On 16 minutes Sam Wakefield made a clever run inside to evade the offside trap and latched on to Priestley's through ball to leave him 1v1 with the keeper, but he saved well as he tried to slide the ball past him. On 20 minutes Priestley slipped Weedall in down the right in the box who delivered a ball to the unmarked Wakefield at the back post but again he was unable to turn the ball in to the net from close range. Just before half time the Pilkington keeper was forced to save again after Sam O'Sullivan jinked his way past two players on the left of the box and put a low square ball into Wakefield but the keeper saved his effort from close range.

Pilkington started the second half brightly and a run down the right by the winger saw a cross pulled back but Town defended well to stop a runner getting a shot away. Pilkington took the lead on 52 minutes after they broke quickly from a Middlewich corner. After the corner was headed out and cleared to the half way line Middlewich attempted to play their way out of trouble and when they lost possession suddenly found themselves outnumbered. Pilkington broke and with 2v1 the forward slid the ball past Masters from just inside the box. 0-1.

Their lead was short lived though as Callum Priestley equalised on 55 minutes. Sam O'Sullivan's free kick on the right was headed clear to the far side for a throw in and when the Pilkington defence momentarily switched off the ball was played to Dean who crossed to Priestley to smash home from close range. 1-1. Middlewich were now in the ascendancy and on 62 Wakefield again found himself with a clear run on goal but under pressure his low shot was once again turned away by the Pilks keeper. James Dean then turned cleverly and hit a left foot drive from the edge of the box in to the keeper's hands.

Town were then dealt a sucker punch as Pilkington regained the lead on 72 minutes. A ball crossed from the right to the far post was headed back towards the edge of the box and the forward had too much time and space to take the ball down and bend a lovely shot into the top corner past Masters who could do little to prevent it. 1-2.

As Middlewich now had to commit more players forward it opened up spaces for Pilkington to counter attack and minutes later they went down the left and crossed to the back post which Joe Devaney did well to clear. They then broke

down the opposite side and Masters had to turn away a shot from the right winger when he was in on goal. At the other end Middlewich had a couple of free kicks that were dealt with by the Pilkington defence and Town were unable to find the equaliser as Pilkington hung on to claim the win and all 3 points.

With rain and hailstone throughout the week the Ruskin Drive pitch was in a heavy condition, despite this the referee made the decision to play and this meant the chance of any free-flowing football for the fans to watch was gone even before the kick off.

With a strong wind-blowing straight up the pitch it was always going to be a game of two-halves and the advantage was with the Pilks in the first half. They we're the team that got into their rhythm the quickest, surging up the pitch and creating a few half chances for Graham Boylan and Danny Hughes.

With Grappenhall struggling with the conditions and the rain and hailstone starting to fall again, Pilks took the lead on the 28th minute. Full-back Jake

Worrall pulled off a great tackle on the touchline and the ball ricocheted to Graham Boylan in space who slotted home nicely with the outside of his foot. Two minutes later Jake Worrall was again rampaging down the left and his cross was missed by the keeper and Brad Smailes scrambled the ball over the line to make it 2-0. With Pilks looking to capitalise further on their advantage Brad Smailes was unlucky as his shot from 20 yards narrowly missed curling into the top right hand corner.

In the 34th minute with the hailstone getting stronger the referee called a halt to the proceedings and with all the players and managers huddled into the dugouts there was one attempt to carry on before play finally resumed 10 minutes later. This seemed to knock Pilks out of their rhythm and Grappenhall started to get a foothold in the game. A few sloppy mistakes at the back gave Grappenhall encouragement and a quick break in the 41st minute resulted in Pilks debutant goalkeeper, Tom Roach bringing down the Grappenhall forward for a penalty. Roach redeemed himself however with an outstanding save as he tipped the penalty over the bar as it veered towards the top-corner.

Pilks were hoping for a good start to the second half to counteract the strong winds but this plan fell apart after one minute. Some slack defending led to the Grappenhall forward being in space, as Roach advanced the shot went past him and was destined to be going wide until it deflected off Pilks defender Dominic Whelan and into the goal. Debutant Jack Baines replaced Josh Woodhall who got injured in the build up to the goal.

It was now game on. Pilks continued to try and pass it around on a difficult surface and they struggled to get out of their own half, the only outlet for seemed to be the lively Baines on the left. Grappenhall's direct play was having greater effect and a few half chances fell their way and a half-hearted penalty shout was waved away by the referee on the 55th minute. Young Dylan Rees came on in the 60th minute for the injured Sean Aimes.

Pilks finally got to grips with Grappenhall's tactics and a little reshuffle nullified their attacks and the game became a midfield battle for most of the remaining second half. Brad Smailes should have wrapped the game up in the 80th minute when he found himself free in the penalty box but lobbed it over the bar rather than placing it past the keeper.

Within the first 10 minutes Pilkington FC had three or four half chances to take an early lead but failed to convert.

The breakthrough came in the 15th minute when Calvin Birchall headed a corner onto the bar and then reacted the quickest to convert the rebound.

Altrincham were struggling to get a foothold in the game and we're relying on some quick counter attacking football to create their chances but resolute defending by the whole back four restricted them to only half chances.

Graham Boylan was a tower of strength up top for Pilkington and his lay offs were paying dividends for the rampaging Jake Worral. On 25 minutes, Worral's run into the box on 25 minutes nearly resulted in another goal, but he couldn't quite cut it back enough for the late arriving Boylan.

A few minutes later some neat play down the left got Brad Smailes free. His cross was met at the far post by Callum Chisnall but his neat header back across goal failed to beat the keeper.

With the Pilkington central midfield trio of Danny Hughes, Andy Mines and Jake Worral all over the opposition midfield like a rash, Altrincham were under pressure for most of the remainder of the half but despite the effort Pilkington failed to convert their pressure.

The message at half-time was about concentration and determination – however the small advantage was wiped out immediately after the kick off. Pilkington defender Ross Travis sliced a clearance and with the Pilkington keeper, Tom Roach hesitant as to whether he could handle it the Altrincham forward challenged him and slotted home to level the score at 1-1.

As a result Tom Roach had to receive treatment from the challenge and spent the rest of the game limping. Altrincham's neat game started to take shape and with constant pressure it was now Pilkington who were playing on the break. Again the back four remained strong under the Altrincham pressure and some neat saves from the injured Tom Roach kept them at bay.

In the 60th minute Graham Boylan scored what would have been the winner. From a corner Boylan's header seemed to creep in at the back post before the defender cleared it. Unfortunately the referee was the only person in the ground unconvinced that it had crossed the line and disallowed it.



With 25 minutes remaining, Matty Taylor came on for Callum Chisnall – a welcome return to action after nearly five months out with knee ligament damage. He was to make an instant impact as he found space on the left and as he cut inside on his right unleashed a curling shot from outside the box that just missed the top corner of the net.

With 20 minutes left, the game was more open with both sides having chances. In midfield it became a battling display with bone-crunching tackles from both sides. Matty Taylor again broke free with 15 minutes to go but his

lack of match fitness shown with the defender recovering to make the tackle.

With 13 minutes to go, the best chance of the match fell to Graham Boylan who after working hard to win the ball back off the central defender found himself through on goal but unfortunately his placement was too close to the keeper.

Debutant Aidy Wintersgill replaced Brad Smailes on the 80th minute and a late rally by Pilkington FC was too no avail as the game ended in a draw.

In terms of providing a great advert for local, amateur sport then this game was it as the fans went away very satisfied after watching a gripping game full of passion, determination and missed chances.

The first half passed without too many chances for either side.

As with the first half, Pilks enjoyed most of the possession but just couldn't find the right pass in the final third.
