An injury ravaged Pilks team were unable to lift themselves enough to compete against the resilient FC St Helens team which on the day simply wanted the result more.

After Danny Hughes pulled up in the warm up it meant that Pilks started the game with both Hughes and striker Matty Taylor playing with injuries.

Both teams missed half chances within the first 5 minutes but things got worse for Pilks in the 10th minute when an horrific challenge from the FC St Helens

full back went unpunished by the referee but left Pilks midfielder Ian McBride with a badly cut ankle which needed hospital treatment.

McBride was replaced by Ian Frazer and with Hughes and Taylor struggling it left Pilks manager, Ste Palfrey with limited options so early in the game.



With Pilks unable to keep their usual disciplined shape, the first half was nip and tuck with both sides having chances and the game itself must have been a good watch for the crowd as it was end to end for most of the game.
